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Leonard A. Pohl Scholarship

A Scholarship for Tualatin High School Seniors

The Leonard A. Pohl Scholarship Fund was established in 1991 to commemorate Mr. Pohl's graduation from Tualatin High School in 1934. The property on which the present Tualatin High School was built is on land once owned and farmed by Mr. Pohl and his wife, Juanita. This scholarship in his name may be awarded to a graduate who intends to enroll in any course of study offered by a **Community College in Oregon**. The primary focus of study *cannot be data processing and/or computer science*. It was Mr. Pohl's intent to encourage and assist students inclined in a career in trades or farming, etc.

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Scholarship Standards

Academic

- Must be a graduate of Tualatin High School and have been a student at the school for the past two (2) years.
- Must be a resident of the city of Tualatin.
- Must have applied to and plan on attending a community college within the State of Oregon in the Fall after graduation.
- Must demonstrate commitment to achieving the highest attainable personal level of academic performance. This standard could be demonstrated with a record of improved grades throughout high school or continued achievement while performing substantial outside job or personal/family commitments.
- Must have identified a goal of earning an associates degree or certificate of completion. The course of study chosen may be any offered by the community college but the primary focus cannot be on data processing or computer science. Mr. Pohl's intention was to promote careers in farm and trade industries.

Financial

- Applicant's need for financial assistance will be considered amongst all the other items.
- Scholarship is for one year of support in the amount of \$500.
