A NEW LOGO

Tim Larson, an Alberta Rider parent, is the Executive Creative Director for *Downstream*, an image design and marketing firm in Portland. Responding to a recent newsletter indicating the Foundation's desire for a new image, Tim volunteered by offering his team's time and creative talent. In the research phase of the project, the team noticed the name of the organization confused the community. Most people were unable to make the distinction between the non-profit, all-volunteer organization and the school district.

Downstream recommended the name be changed to "*The Foundation for Tigard Tualatin Schools*", placing emphasis on our charitable organization. In addition, Tim's staff developed a new logo and tagline, separate from that used by the school district. The logo features a whimsical green 'T' and red 'T' that resemble people locking arms, with a tag line, "*Smart kids. Smart community.*" A video is also being created by Downstream to be used in our schools and with other community organizations.

To coincide with these improvements, the marketing committee recommended a new email and website address of foundation4smartkids.org. The new website has been created and updated by our new webmaster, Daniel Payne.

INNOVATIVE GRANTS PROGRAM

Innovative Grant in Memory of Linda Joel

The legacy of a dedicated school volunteer is living on through a generous donation that will benefit Tigard-Tualatin students. Les and Lori Joel have established a \$60,000 innovative grants program in memory of Les' mother, *Linda Joel*.

Each year, for the next 12 years, the Joels will donate \$5,000 to fund a unique classroom program that provides expanded opportunities for Tigard-Tualatin students. Applications are available now via email and will be due February 2.

Born in Germany, she came to the United States and settled near Cincinnati, Ohio. Linda earned an associate degree and worked as a secretary at Procter & Gamble until her son, Les, was born.

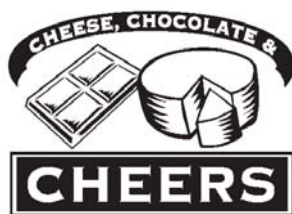
Throughout her life, Linda Joel was a huge advocate of public schools. From the time he entered school, Les remembers his mom as constantly volunteering and being active in the schools. "She wanted a quality education for me and she didn't want to opt out for private school," he said. "She felt she was doing her part by dedicating her time at my schools."

Years after he had graduated, Les said that people wouldn't necessarily remember him, but they remembered his mom and the lasting impression she made by always being in the classroom.

Linda Joel was also very active in advocating for local bond measures. The schools in the Cincinnati area were funded by local dollars, so they were constantly campaigning for money. Les said his mom would often feel the frustration from failed measures. She couldn't understand why voters wouldn't approve of the necessary funding for schools.

When Linda died, Les decided that he would honor her by donating money to the district where his children attend school. Les and Lori wanted the funds to be used in a meaningful way that would celebrate Linda's passion for education.

The Foundation for Tigard Tualatin Schools worked with the Joels to create the "Innovative Grants Program." Each year, a \$5,000 grant will be awarded to the teacher(s) wanting to implement a new and innovative model in their classrooms. The grant has been designed to be very flexible, allowing for teachers to be creative in their proposals.

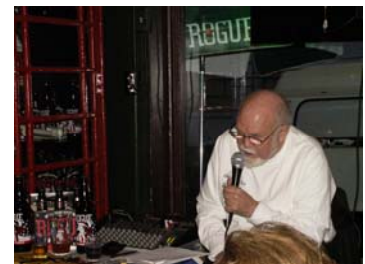


EVENT RAISES \$9,000

DECEMBER SHOPPING RAISES FUNDS

Washington Square merchants have collected food for the District's Caring Closet to share with families in need.

The mall also contributed 100% of its proceeds from its annual *Friends and Family Discount Shopping* weekend in December to the Caring Closet.

With approximately 400 children served as of late November, the Caring Closet's "1K" Campaign is well under way. To reach the goal of serving 1,000 kids during '06-'07, the Closet depends upon the support of school personnel who make referrals and volunteers and businesses who donate their time, money and goods.

MY DONATION — Where Does It Go?

Many of us know that the Caring Closet takes donations of new or gently used clothing, but what does my cash donation cover? The Caring Closet currently purchases new shoes, socks, and underwear for students, and provides gift cards for special items we do not stock (i.e. bras). We also purchase toothbrushes, toothpaste, bar soap and other items that are included in the hygiene bags provided to all students utilizing the Closet for the first-time.

The Caring Closet has a new logo, compliments of Melanie Belshee and Breal Marketing www.brealmktg.com. Their motto/objective is "Providing Clothing (and more!) to Keep Kids in School".

Also, they will be moving from moving from their current site in Tualatin to a portable near Tigard High School. An open house will be held in the spring.
